

## FIREWISE USA/TOWN OF ST. JAMES

Amidst the beauty of the vast areas of forest in St. James, we often overlook the potential for forest 'Ire. The Town **B** Firewise Committee wants to again remind residents that the potential for forest 'Ire in St. James is real, especially as we come into the summer months when the ground can be particularly dry in the absence of rain. We are reminded of the devastation that took place in Lahaina, Hawaii where a forest 'Ire devastated the community.

Where developed areas are contiguous to forested land, it is known as the Wildlife Urban Interface. Residents of St. James may be surprised to learn that North Carolina ranks #1 in the nation for areas of Urban Wildlife Interface. Where Wildlife Urban Interface exists, so does the potential for damaging forest 'lres.

To address this issue, the Town of St. James participates in the Firewise USA program sponsored by the National Fire Protection Association. The program is designed to assist communities with 'Inding ways to reduce the potential for forest 'Ires. St. James is one of only three communities in Brunswick County to be recognized by Firewise USA as a certi'led Firewise Community.

Maintaining our Firewise Certi<sup>1</sup>cation can be of great value in the event of a community <sup>1</sup>re. Firewise certi<sup>1</sup>ed communities are often the <sup>1</sup>rst to receive Federal and State Aid for disaster recovery. There are some simple, easy steps to help reduce damage from a wild<sup>1</sup>re AHEAD of the <sup>1</sup>re itself.
