

## An Ordinance Establishing The Town of St. James as a Bird Sanctuary Ordinance 2018-01

WHERAS, pursuant to N.C. General Statute 160A-188 a town may by ordinance create and establish a bird sanctuary within the town limits; and

WHERAS, the Town Council for the Town of St. James finds that it is appropriate and in keeping with the natural heritage of the town that a bird sanctuary within the town limits be created.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council for the Town of St. James, North Carolina as follows:

- 1. As used herein, the term "Bird Sanctuary" includes an area of land that supports the conservation of year-round and migratory bird species and their natural habitats.
- 2. A Bird Sanctuary is hereby created and established within the town to conform with the corporate boundaries thereof pursuant to N.C.G.S. 160A-188.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, kill trap or otherwise take any protected birds within the town limits except pursuant to a permit issued by the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission. Abandoned bird nests or nests not containing eggs, may be removed with the exception of nests made by birds of prey.
- 4. For birds deemed a nuisance by owners or organizations within the Town of St. James all Federal, N.C. State laws, and North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission rules must be followed.
- 5. A violation of this ordinance shall constitute a Class 3 misdemeanor and shall be punishable in accordance with State laws.
- 6. Enforcement of this Ordinance shall be at the discretion of Brunswick County Animal Control Department and/or the State of North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission.
